## **Learning English with Apps - Android**





- Apps are applications (small pieces of software) that run on a mobile phone, computer, or other electronic devices.
- > They can be downloaded from Google Play onto a cellphone or tablet.
- > Many of them are free of charge.
- Apps help learners control their own learning and allow them to have a language resource with them at all times.
- Most learners have mobile phones, even if they don't have reliable Internet at home or don't have a home computer.
- Phones have a 24/7 connection to the Internet that allows learners to access the World Wide Web.
- With groups of learners, apps can be used to create a language lab in any meeting room that has an Internet connection. Teachers can allot time for individual practice with the app, then circulate to observe or use the time to work one-on-one with learners.

Why use apps?

- How do learners find apps?
- Learners can search using key words such as "ESL," "learn English," or "English pronunciation (writing, reading, etc.)."
- They can screen the apps, try them out, and find the ones that best fit their learning needs.
- > As learners' language needs change, they can search for new apps.
- New apps are constantly being developed; therefore, the apps listed on this tip sheet may change. As you (and your learners) discover new apps, let your Rural Routes Advisor know so the tip sheet can be updated.

Here are some free apps to explore. Many free apps contain ads; paid upgrades are often available.

Ranking is included, if available. A form is provided for your input on the usefulness of the app (see page 2). This will help Rural Routes to keep (as much as possible) an updated list of recommended apps.

All purpose apps for both Android and Apple

- Busuu (Ranking: 4.6) Pre-CLB to CLB 8. Teaches sentence patterns, and develops listening and pronunciation. Great for phrases and vocabulary. Provides repetition, especially good for difficult words.
- Duolingo (Ranking: 4.7) Pre-CLB to CLB 6. Includes ~30 languages. Learners can change the settings so the translations are in their native language. Very similar to Busuu.
- Mango Languages (Ranking 4.8) Downloadable lessons in several languages. Vocabulary, pronunciation, grammar, and culture. Interactive words and phrases, pronunciation pointers, and cultural insights. Connect with the local library for more resources.

	4.2	L,R,S	ESL Fast Speak (Ron Lee) CLB 1-6. Easy conversations with transcripts. Daily life, school life, health, sports, transportation, and safety. Good starting point for listening, reading, and speaking.
